

Meeting called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Pres. Bodish.

Pres. Bodish led pledge of allegiance:

PWD Boyle – Routine Streets work, Sanitation pick up and Building Maintenance. May completed jobs were cleaned boiler, installed benches at the Monument, tire drop- 93 tires, open pavilion for rentals, pool prep work, install woman's restroom door at ballfield, removed ash screw for replacement on boiler, installed plaques on benches at the monument, installed flags throughout the borough, set up and clean up for street sweeping. Projected jobs for June are as follows; open pool for the season, finish ball field bathroom doors, replace signs at Parkway and Saylor Park, remove sidewalk at 12<sup>th</sup> Street for tree removal, add electric to Town Square Gazebo and repair storm drain at the upper lot of the Parkway.

BCO Helman –Month of May 2021- 31 permits with a total of \$6,309.25

Chief Genovese reported 212 calls for service, 7 crimes- 2 thefts, 1 sale and manufacturing of marijuana, 3 ordinance violations and 1 crime mischief- 11 traffic violations, 4 written warning, 8 borough parking tickets and 35 parking tickets issued for street cleaning.

Chief Bechtel reported –10 incidents –The department has had multiple fundraisers over the past month, which have all done well. Five members have completed firefighter 1 training in Lower Macungie.

Bachman – The borough auditors Kirk & Summa came in on June 1<sup>st</sup> to prep for the finalizing of the audit, which should be done next week. Bachman has received all information to place the fire truck on Muncibid for purchase, which will be advertised on June 10<sup>th</sup> in the Whitehall Coplay Press and on Muncibid.

Sodl – Thanked Chief Bechtel and Chief Genovese for their services to the community.

Burker- Park & Recreation- Spoke about the prices set for non-residents for pool passes. The committee also presented somethings for the summer which include, 2 dip and dance scheduled for July 15<sup>th</sup> & August 12<sup>th</sup> at 8 PM, movie in the park July 13<sup>th</sup> & August 10<sup>th</sup> at 8:00 PM, Arts in the Park at the pavilion October 2<sup>nd</sup> & October 3<sup>rd</sup>, Christmas in July is scheduled for July 25<sup>th</sup>. Coplay Community Days has donated \$20,000.00 to help upgrade the basketball courts.

Molitoris- Reported with the help from Kim we have had two vendors to look at the police department flooring to get estimates. Also Kim will be reaching out to get estimates for painting the police department.

Eisenhower- Finance- The borough has received paperwork for the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund at this time it is just asking for the office to gather information for this funding. Regarding the financial planner Janet is still looking into this.
